One of the greatest steps the athletic program took was in \$\int_{\text{0}}\$5 to join Texas Association of Private and Parochial Schools, or TAPPS.




saw a name change from First Baptist Christian School to Bay Area Christian School.



Our varsity tennis program went from one member in 2001 to a full team in






The new high school building was built in January of 2011. Compared to the previous high school building, which was 1 floor and 6 classrooms, the new building has 2 floors and 15 classrooms.
