

# COLLEGE TIMELINE FOR SOPHMORES

## AUGUST

\_\_\_\_\_ **Check credits** to make sure you are on schedule for graduation requirements.

\_\_\_\_\_ **Check** to make sure your courses meet college entrance requirements

## SEPTEMBER

\_\_\_\_\_ Review for the PSAT/NMSQT. Study the PSAT/NMSQT Student Bulletin and old tests. Use computer and printed aids for study and review additional materials at [www.collegeboard.org](http://www.collegeboard.org)

## OCTOBER/NOVEMBER

\_\_\_\_\_ **Take the PSAT/NMSQT.** At BACS, all Sophomores & Juniors take the PSAT.  
On the test form, check the box which will put you on the mailing list for college information.

## DECEMBER/JANUARY

\_\_\_\_\_ Plan a program of study for your junior year with your high school counselor. Learn about opportunities to earn college credit. Take as many academic courses as possible.

\_\_\_\_\_ Study your PSAT/NMSQT score report. Compare items missed with the correct responses at collegeboard.org

\_\_\_\_\_ Set up an appointment and meet with the high school counselor to discuss dual credit options.

## THROUGHOUT THE YEAR

\_\_\_\_\_ **Continue** taking the appropriate courses.

\_\_\_\_\_ **Maintain good grades.**

\_\_\_\_\_ Gather and review information about colleges.

\_\_\_\_\_ Continue to review career choices. Check out materials.

\_\_\_\_\_ **Choose 11<sup>th</sup> grade courses wisely!**
